	experience that involves the child actively participating in such traditions and immersing				
	themselves in such values and attitudes. The child's interests, hobbies or membership				
	of societies are not relevant.

	Headteacher, together with the school stamp. They may be contacted at a future date				
	to confirm their verification of the applicant. If a successful applicant is subsequently				
	found to have submitted false verification, the Governors will reserve the right to ask the child to leave the school.
