

Curriculum Intent

Students will build on their understanding of rights and responsibilities and begin to apply this knowledge to a wider national and global issue in waste and recycling. This is designed to look at how, considering the lack of clear legislation, citizens need to consider how their individual actions can impact the environment. Students will also be able to draw on their understanding in other curriculum areas and begin to conduct quantitative and qualitative research, and analyse data, to better understand the issue. This unit will also enable students to consider what steps they can take as informed and active citizens to address this area of concern, and develop curricular understanding so that students can better understand the purpose of what they are learning.
