

Anglo European School Remote Learning Plan - Revised January 2022

- The most recent DfE guidance has stipulated that schools in England will remain open unless staffing levels fall to an unmanageable level. It will be up to individual schools to determine whether or not they are able to remain open for all students or for some students.
- In the instance of partial closure, with some year groups remaining in school and other year groups being educated remotely, we will revert to our remote learning plan as outlined below.
- There are different phases (outlined below) which are reasonably straightforward and will allow us to smoothly transition between phases as necessary.

<p>Phase 1</p>	<p>The school is fully open. Some students are unable to attend as they are isolating at home.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lessons continue as normal • It is a legal requirement that staff set work for any self-isolating students via SMHW • Work must be set for every lesson which the student misses due to isolation. This should include classwork and homework and should be in line with what the students in school are completing in class. Teachers should use SMHW to record classwork and homework and use of Showbie is encouraged for interactive work for those isolating and so that all students are able to receive similar feedback on their work. Teachers must continue to assess work regularly.
<p>Phase 2</p>	<p>The school is partially open. However, some full classes or Year groups have been asked to stay at home. Year Groups may be attending school on a rota.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff attend school as normal • Lessons continue as normal for those students attending school • Staff to teach classes who are isolating using Showbie Live. • Staff must ensure that they use the record function in Showbie live to ensure that all students can access this lesson • It is the responsibility of the teacher to ensure that they have a webcam/mic from IT so that students can see their teacher online • Teachers should use the classroom in which they would usually have taught that lesson unless they have alternative office space • Teachers must continue to assess work regularly.
<p>Phase 3</p>	<p>The school is closed for a short period (e.g. two weeks) to all but vulnerable children and those of key workers.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff to teach all lessons remotely using Showbie live. Students expected to log in for all of their lessons and complete work set by teachers • Teachers to use the record function in Showbie to ensure that all students can access the lesson • Staff to remain available online for the duration of the timetabled lesson to provide support/assessment. Please note, we cannot expect all students to be available online at the time of our lesson. • Staff rota in place for students attending school • Teachers must continue to assess work regularly.
<p>Phase 4</p>	<p>The school is closed for an extended period to all but vulnerable children and those of key workers.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remote teaching will be a blended programme of live and pre-recorded lessons. • Staff to set work via SMHW in advance of timetabled lessons by 9am on the day of the lesson. • Full remote learning plan implemented – using Showbie for live lessons or to upload pre-recorded lessons. • Assessment to move on-line – predominantly via Showbie and also email or directly on SMHW. Assessment will follow the usual

		<p>assessment policy and teachers will indicate to students which pieces of work are going to be assessed in advance.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Staff rota in place for students attending school• Teachers must continue to assess work regularly.
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
