Aims of the School:

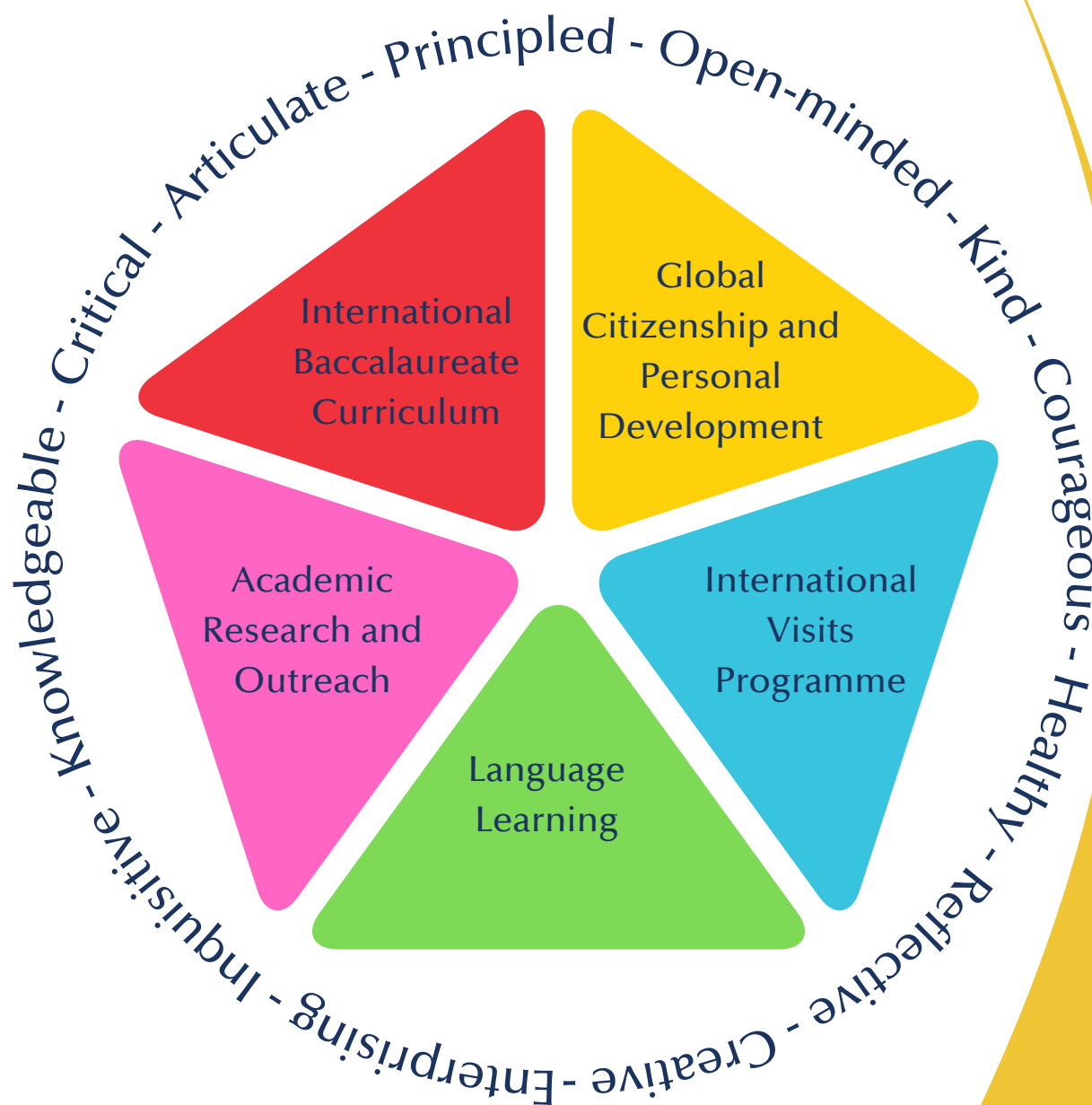
Excelencia: To achieve academic excellence through a broad, balanced & inclusive curriculum enriched by a strong international dimension.

Our school is determined to ensure that an education with an international dimension is compatible with high academic and outstanding personal development for all students whatever their background or ability. Our staff are highly experienced, qualified and committed to delivering high quality education to our students. Examination performance is consistently above world averages.

Approaches to Learning

As an IB World School, it is important that we teach students these five essential skills explicitly in an integrated way, in all subjects.

Digital Literacy Research



We teach students digital literacy through all subjects. Students develop the ability to research effectively and to adhere to academic honesty guidelines.

Social



We teach students how to work with others effectively. We help students to identify their own strengths and weaknesses and to balance these across a team, and to value the views of others. Students learn how to reflect and consider improvements for future projects.

Thinking



We teach students how to think critically about information and to identify misinformation. We encourage students to consider ideas from different perspectives and to reflect on how they know things in different subjects.

Self-management



We teach students how to manage their work, their time and their emotions. We show students how to be principled and to act with integrity.

Communication



We teach students how to communicate to varied audiences and for different purposes via a range of media.

Enrichment Beyond The Classroom

In our International Sixth Form, education goes far beyond academic study. Our wider curriculum is designed to equip students with the real-world skills, global awareness and personal development essential for life beyond school.

Active Citizenship & Leadership

Students explore topics such as human rights, mental health, financial literacy and destinations pathways. Many leadership and prefect roles are available, allowing students to partake in Student Voice Committees and develop confidence and communication skills.

Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS)

CAS enables students to enhance their personal and interpersonal development by learning through experience. Students choose to manage projects which develop leadership and service to others. CAS groups range from International Day, Model United Nations, Charities, Community and Amnesty International amongst others.

Extra-Curricular Clubs & Societies

Our vibrant extra-curricular offering include the Debating Society, Enterprise Club, Creative Writing, Sports, Theatre, Literacy Mentors and Anime Club.

Students are also actively encouraged to demonstrate initiative and leadership by proposing and establishing new clubs in response to their own interests and passions.



International Visits, Exchanges and Work Experience Programme

Our international curriculum is enriched by a diverse and ambitious programme of visits and exchanges. Sixth Form students have the opportunity to take part in a wide range of inspiring international visits and cultural exchanges—designed to deepen their global perspective, enhance academic learning, and create unforgettable memories.

Our work experience exchanges involve students spending two weeks developing their language whilst benefitting from the full immersion offered by working in a variety of placements such as schools, bakeries, pharmacies and banks.

The experience allows them to gain confidence and experience in their chosen language. Currently there are exchanges to France, Spain, Germany, Italy and China.

UK study based & Cross curricular visits

Geography, Biology and Environmental Systems and Societies students have the opportunity to enhance their studies by taking part in fieldwork with the Field Studies Council at Slapton Ley and Dale Fort.

We also have a range of cross-curricular residentials that aim to support students' wider studies and appreciation of the world for example, our long running visit to Poland and Vienna.

The visit to Geneva takes in the dual focus of the particle accelerator at CERN alongside visiting a number of UN agencies. We also offer visits to Iceland and South Korea to give students an appreciation of different cultures, geographies and economies.

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

Why study the IB Diploma?

The IB Diploma is an academic and broad programme that prepares students exceptionally well for success at university and life beyond, which is recognised and respected by the world's leading universities.

What do I study?

Students study three subjects at Higher Level and three subjects at Standard Level. This includes Mathematics, English Literature, a Science, a Humanities subject, a Language and an Arts subject.

What is unique about the IB Diploma?

The Diploma Programme prepares students for effective participation in a rapidly evolving and increasingly global society as they:

- enhance their understanding of a broad range of subject areas
- develop the competencies which prepare them for higher education
- increase their understanding of other cultures, as well as their own
- make connections across traditional academic disciplines and explore the nature of knowledge through the programme's unique Theory of Knowledge course
- undertake in-depth research into an area of interest through the lens of one or more academic disciplines in the Extended Essay
- enhance their personal and interpersonal development through the Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) programme
- create personal statements of global distinction allowing them to apply to the most prestigious universities globally

International Baccalaureate Career- related Programme

Why study the IB Career-related Programme?

The IB Career-related Programme readies students for the global and dynamic working world. It is designed for students who are eager to align their academic studies with their future professional ambitions.

What do I study?

The programme combines internationally recognised IB Diploma Programme (DP) courses with A Level options including one career-related A level from Business Studies, PE, Law and Computer Science. The core of the programme includes second language acquisition to enhance global employability, Service Learning to foster community engagement, and a Personal and Professional Skills course to build essential workplace competencies.

What is unique about the IB Career-related Programme?

- A tailored blend of academic and career-related learning
- Development of transferable, career-related competencies
- Internationally minded education with global relevance
- In-depth independent research through the Reflective Project
- Practical experience and community engagement through Service Learning

3 A Level Plus - A Blended Academic Experience

Why study the 3 A Level Plus Route?

The 3 A Level Plus (Advanced Level/International Baccalaureate) route offers a hybrid, rigorous curriculum, combining the academic depth of A Levels with the global perspective and varied assessment styles of the IB.

What do I study?

Students choose 3 A Levels plus either one IB Standard Level course or the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ).

What is unique about this route?

IB Standard courses are assessed through a combination of internal coursework and external exams, while the EPQ challenges students to conduct independent research and produce a 5,000-word project, an excellent preparation for university-level study.

This route is ideal for students who:

- Want to keep breadth in their subject choices
- Prefer varied assessment methods
- Seek an academically enriching and rigorous experience



4 A Level Route - A Traditional Academic Pathway

Why study A Levels?

Our 4 A Level programme offers students the opportunity to study four subjects in depth over two years. This route is ideal for those who wish to specialise in areas such as sciences, languages, or humanities, or maintain breadth by combining different subject areas.

What do I study?

Students complete four courses. The majority of courses are linear with an examination at the end of the two years of study. Some courses have an element of coursework.

What is unique about the 4 A Level pathway?

Completing four A Levels is highly regarded by Oxbridge and Russell Group institutions. The academic challenge of maintaining such breadth ensures that students can explain the synergies between subject disciplines. In addition, students have the opportunity to:

- Choose an additional Introductory language course
- Undertake the Citizenship programme
- complete the Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) programme
- complete a super-curricular MOOC
