Students must demonstrate spoken skills in presentations, discussions and responses to different themes, initiating face-to-face interactions 30%. Listening, Reading, Writing. Manipulate language accurately using a range of lexis and structure. Translate, summarise, and adapt material for different audiences and registers. Respond in French or English on a range material. Show knowledge and understanding of different aspects of the French culture and respond to these critically and analytically.
