French is one of the most widely-spoken languages in the world and study of one of the IB Language B courses provides an excellent opportunity to develop fluency and to consider how the cultures we are exposed to influence our ways of knowing and our perceptions. Through this course we develop in particular the skills of resilience, independence, open-mindedness and effective communication. IB French pupils are also encouraged to take risks, to develop an in-depth curiosity about the target language culture and to be reflective students.
