You will study a number of different topics and develop a wide range of geographical skills. The core themes look at the issues surrounding population, resources, and development in the global society. You will also study three of the following optional themes: Freshwater—issues and conflicts. Oceans and their coastal margins. Extreme environments. Hazards and disasters—risk assessment and response. Leisure, sport and tourism. The geography of food and health. Urban environments.	WHY STUDY THIS SUBJECT? Geography is a broad and dynamic subject that is firmly grounded in the real world. It helps to explain the similarities and differences between spaces and places across a variety of scales and perspectives. Geography inspires students to examine key local, national and global issues appreciating our shared responsibility as citizens of an increasingly interconnected world. HOW IS IT ASSESSED? Students are assessed through examinations and an internal assessment based around a fieldwork question. Paper 1. 25% of total. Exam 1hr 30 mins. Answer 2 out of 3 questions on the core theme (multiple parts per question). Paper 2 35% of total. Exam 2hrs. Paper 3. 20% of total. Exam 1 hr. Internal Assessment 20% of total. 2500 words. A fieldwork report based on primary data collected in the field.
