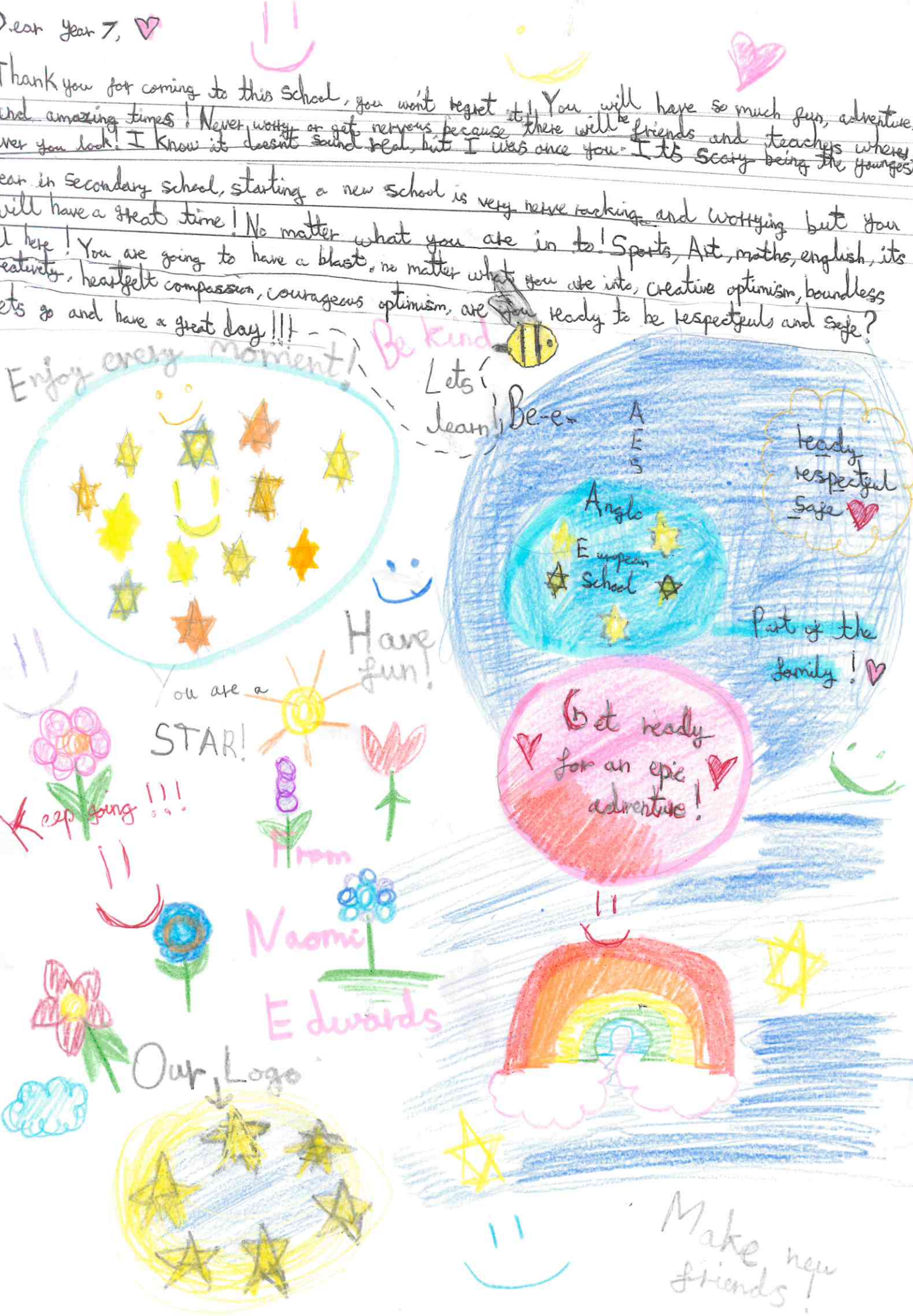

## ebblinghem

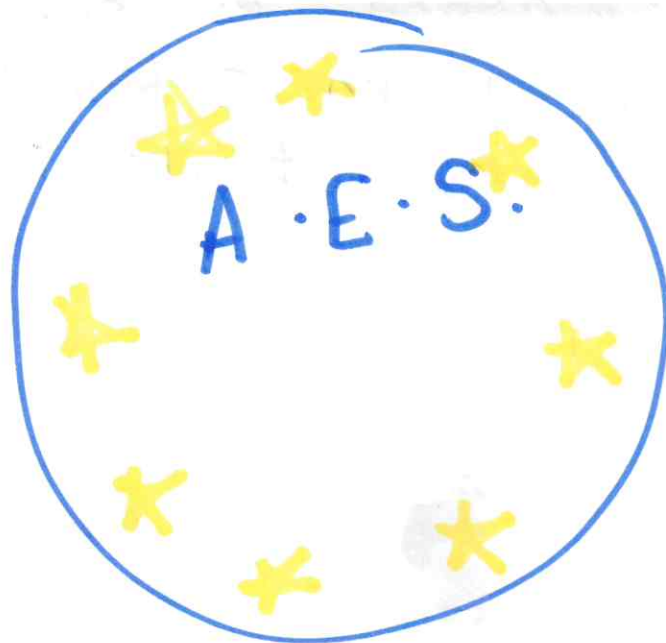
