

SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE

“School is a place of work for people of a wide range of ages. Sensitivity needs to be shown in everyone’s choice of clothing. Nothing should be worn that can give a reasonable person any cause for embarrassment or offence. This sometimes involves saying ‘No’ to certain items of clothing.

*The Dress Code set out below recognises that you are young adults in a School community with a cosmopolitan ethos, but one that wants students to work in a **professional working environment**”.*

- **No football shirts or shorts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings**
 - **Shirts and tops must be long enough to be able to be tucked into trousers, shorts and skirts**
 - **Underwear should be covered at all times**
 - **No beach-wear (this includes but is not limited to: board shorts, flip-flops, sliders, low cut/sleeveless/ off the shoulder/ strapless tops and dresses, spaghetti strap t shirts/vest tops)**
 - **No logos or slogans on shirts (except the manufacturer’s name – but no fcuk logos are allowed)**
 - **There must be no more than the width of a mobile phone between the knee and the hem of a skirt/shorts or a dress**
 - **No ripped or torn clothing of any sort**
 - **No hats, caps or hoods**
 - **In hot weather, plain or tailored shorts are acceptable. Jersey material or sports shorts are not permitted**
 - **There are no restrictions on hair, jewellery is permitted with the exception of facial piercings, these must be replaced with clear piercing retainers whilst in school.**
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The above dress code reflects the simple fact that School is a place of work and what you wear contributes to the creation of a working environment.

The key phrase should be “*Smart but Casual*”.
If in doubt, ASK

Students who violate the code will be sent home to change or offered alternative clothing. Persistent offenders will potentially be subject to a Student Contract.
