








Reading Strategy


- No child reaches the end of KS3 without having achieved their chronological age in reading

Achievement

Key Stage 4	Sixth Form				
 85% of our students gained a standard pass in both English and mathematics. The Year 11 students achieved, on average, a grade 6 from their best 8 GCSE grades. Their achievement was across the board was some of the most impressive in Essex. Our students gained higher grades than comparable students nationally – estimated as one fifth of a grade higher their peers on all GCSEs. Students had particularly strong achievements and progress in English, Humanities and Languages, compared to their peers nationally. 	 87% of year group applied to University, 7% have secured apprenticeships, 4% plan to take a gap year and 2% are going directly into work 82% of university applications obtained their firm choice – meaning that they will be attending their desired university 31% of these students will be attending a Russell Group university, often deemed to be the most prestigious universities For those students taking A levels, 55% were graded A* to B For those studying the IB Diploma Programme, 78% were graded 7 to 5.
