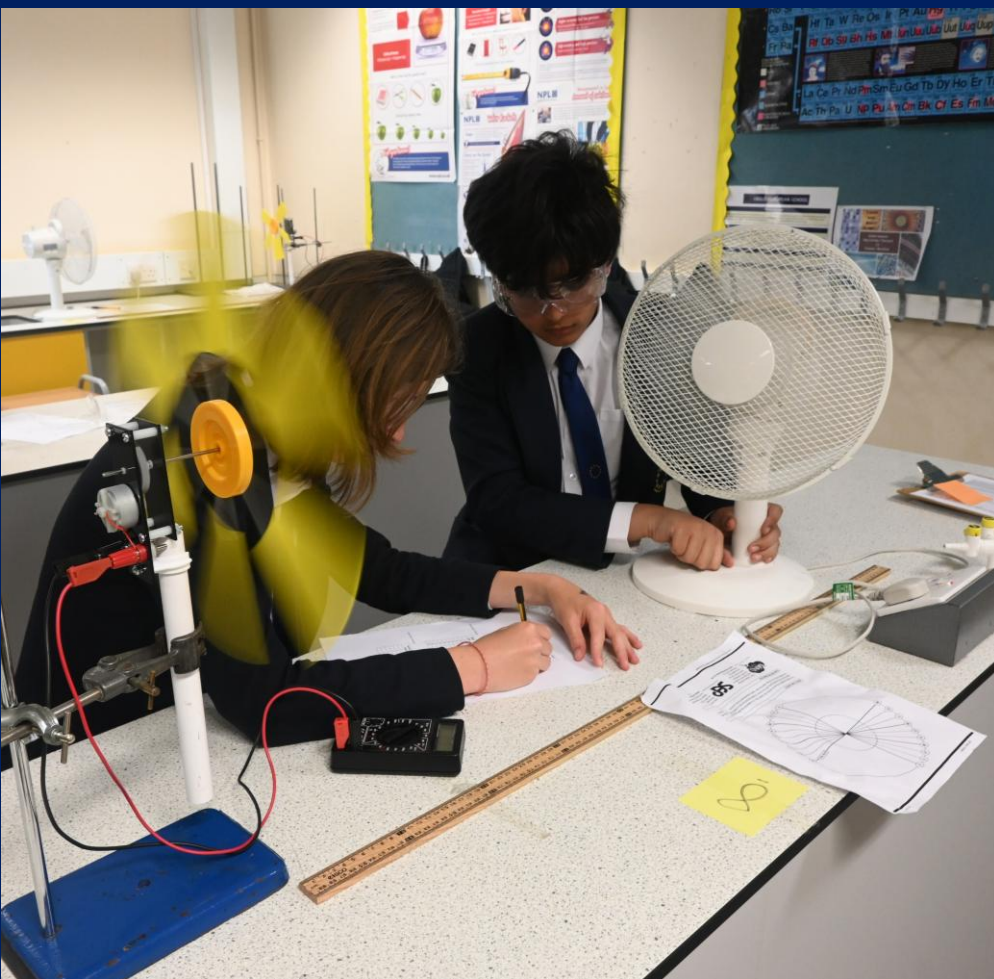

Student Achievement:	School Achievements
Key Stage 4: • 79% of our students gained a standard pass in both English and Mathematics, well above the regional and national averages. • Our students gained higher grades than comparable students nationally both in terms of attainment and progress. • Students had particularly strong achievements in English, Humanities and Languages. • Our average number of GCSEs is well above national average. Most students take 10 GCSEs or more.
