Assignment: *Personal Sketchbook Project*

Independent Learning Task: *Students will be asked to create a 10-page sketchbook and produce images for each of the pages from a set of tasks.*

How it links to the Specification: *Each of these tasks is designed to allow students to present work from each of the Edexcel Assessment Objectives – Record, Develop, Explore and Present*

Task Brief:

Make a 10 page sketchbook from whatever materials you like (paper, fabric, plastic, card, recycling etc). It can range in size from A5 – A3 and should be bound or contained in some way (i.e. Not loose leaves). It should have a cover, which can be decorated or made from a different material than the rest of the book. The book must be handmade and not bought and then adapted!! You should complete work for each page based upon the following starting points:

1. Create an image that explains your reasons for choosing this subject
2. Draw a flat object
3. Without copying their work, create an image that shows who your favourite artist/designer is
4. Describe, in detail, a piece of work you have seen in a gallery or museum
5. Create an image of something old
6. Create an image of something that changes
7. Create a flat image of a collection of objects that have different textures using mark making
8. Make the most interesting texture in 3D
9. Use a new material
10. Describe what you have learnt from this process

Please note that 'drawing' does not have to be with a pen or a pencil – the term loosely encapsulates the method of recording in any medium e.g. photography, sewing, collage, applique, wire, etc.

The purpose of this process is to enable me to understand your creative approach to a problem. It is therefore essential that you give each of the tasks a great deal of thought. There is certainly no right or wrong way to approach this and you should consider to what I mean by 'Create' 'Describe' 'Make' 'Use'.

This work will need to be presented in your first Textiles lesson. I look forward to seeing your sketchbooks in September!
