Citizenship is taught as a discreet subject ([see Curriculum Map](#)) but also permeates the wider curriculum as all subjects commit to preparing our students for life as global citizens, ready to take up their place in a global society: aware of their responsibilities as well as their rights. Political literacy, enterprise education, an awareness of ethics, personal health and well-being, human rights and an understanding of the legal system all feature in the Citizenship curriculum. It encourages young people to understand the importance of volunteering, the meaning of service above self and the value of giving.

Model United Nations, Global Action, Anglo Council and Executive, Helping Hands, Litterbusters, Charities, career related learning, providing meaningful encounters with future employers, all feature in the curriculum plan. Theme days also enrich the provision, covering topics such as mental and sexual health and well-being, community action, crime awareness, drug awareness, International Day.

From 2020, the Gatsby standards have been fully realized and work experience in Year 10 continues to be a requirement of the Anglo curriculum. Like our visits programme, it challenges and inspires young people and contributes significantly to their holistic education. A considerable number choose to take their work experience abroad. Our very own Diplome du Citôyen is awarded at Foundation (Key Stage 3), Intermediate (Key Stage 4) and Advanced (Sixth Form). It provides a permanent record of the way in which the unique provision in this school has impacted on each individual child.
